

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NEXT STEPS...

Some things which need to be kept in mind while studying in the College of Veterinary Science, GADVASU, Ludhiana.



- Carrying a valid student identity card is mandatory for all the students.
- B.V.Sc. & A.H. student shall collect the prescribed identity card proforma from the Office of Dean COVS, fill his/ her details, paste a recent passport sized photograph and submit the same in the Office of Dean, COVS.
- Identity card may be collected from the Office of Dean, COVS within 10-15 working days of submission.
- Identity card needs to be submitted back to the Office of Dean, COVS at the end of degree.



- Both GADVASU and PAU share the Hospital to provide medical facilities to students.
- Location: Opposite Mini Shopping Complex, in front of Bank of Baroda.
- Medical card required to avail the facilities.
- How to apply: Contact office of Welfare officer and show them your admission fee slip to get a prescribed proforma for application of medical card.
- Fill it and affix a recent passport size photograph and submit it there in same office.
- You can collect it from same office after 15 days.



- Computerised and automated University Library has all the modern facilities and resources to support the curricula.
- Students with valid Student Library Card can get books issued from Library for studying at hostels or home.
- Proforma for Student Library Card can be obtained from the Library Counter and after submitting the filled proforma forwarded by the Advisor, the card can be collected from the University Library.
- Identity card needs to be submitted back to the Office of University Librarian at the end of degree.
- Enrolled students shall be assigned a login ID to avail university internet facilities.

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- Keep the medical card with you till completion of degree to get the No Dues Certificate for award of the degree.
- In case of any medical exigency, the application has to be forwarded from the Chief Medical Officer, PAU Hospital, Ludhiana, to claim the benefits.
- In case of any injury during the students stay in the University, if the case is recommended from Chief Medical Officer, PAU Hospital and the student gets treatment from any private hospital the University shall refund 70% of total expenditure recurred on producing the original bills.



College is having a dedicated 1 Pb R&V SQN NCC Unit, which imparts NCC training to the students.

NOTE

- NRI students shall enroll for Cocurricular activities instead of NCC.
- Enrollment forms shall be filled by the students in the NCC class.
- Students are advised to open their account in Bank of Baroda for scholarships, Internship allowance and NCC related payments.
- Students shall know their bank Account Number, IFSC code and Aadhaar card number.
- To allow entry into the University, the two wheeler should be pasted with a University Pass.
- Student can get these pass from Punjab Agricultural University (Thapar Hall) after paying the prescribed fee.

Attendance





- A candidate having attendance below 75% in scheduled Theory and Practical classes separately for each subject shall not be eligible to appear in the annual examination of that subject which shall be counted from the date of registration for First year students.
- University is very strict with any act of indiscipline and can lead to conduct prohibition, expulsion from hostel and also rustication depending upon the level of indiscipline.
- Detailed Rules and Regulations are given in the Prospectus.

Advisory System

College has a unique and functional system of allotting an advisor to each individual student.

- Advisors act as their guardians away from home.
- Students can discuss and take appropriate advisement regarding any issues pertaining to them.



Veterinary Curriculum includes following two components:

- a) Core Courses
- b) Internship including Entrepreneurial Training

What is professional year? Is professional year means one year or more than that sometimes?

Professional year' means a period consisting of minimum two hundred and ten (210) instructional days, excluding annual examination days except fourth professional year which consists of 315 instructional days.



What does this 4+3 mean? A credit hour of 4+3 means there will be four theory classes and three practical classes per week.

What are the credit hours?

Credit hours means the weekly unit of work recognized for any subject as per the course catalogue. A lecture class of one hour per week shall count as one credit. A practical class of two hour, in a course, a working period of three hour in Clinical Complex/Livestock Farm Complex (LFC) per week shall count as one credit.






- Grade Point (GP): Total marks obtained in a subject out of 100 divided by 10.
- Credit Point (CP): Grade Point multiplied by credit hours.
- Total Credit Points: Sum of the credit points secured.
- Grade Point Average: Sum of total credit points earned divided by sum of credit hours.
- Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA): Sum of grand total of credit points earned divided by grand sum of credit hours.

Let's understand it by an example

Mr. X got 82 marks out of 100 in Anatomy, 84 in LPM & 86 in Physiology. His GP of each subject & OGPA is Anatomy (4+3=7): GP is 82/10 =8.2 ; CP = $8.2 \times 7 = 57.4$ LPM (4+2 =6) : GP is 84/10 =8.4 ; CP = $8.4 \times 6 = 50.4$ Physiology (4+1 =5) : GP is 86/10 =8.6 ; CP = $8.6 \times 5 = 43$ Thus, OGPA of Mr. X = 57.4+50.4+43 / 7+6+5 = 150.8/18 = 8.38

Your hard work does not go unrewarded. Hard work really pays rich dividends Scholarships/merit certificates/medals act as a reward to student's academic achievement and educational programs. Furthermore, these indicate recognition for effort and success, act as motivational force, encourages participation and a golden opportunity for genuine aspirants.

Scope of Scholarships

- University Scholarships are awarded to the meritorious students on the basis of rank/ marks obtained in the qualifying test/ examination.
- VCI merit scholarships for under-graduate programmes as per eligibility.
- Dr. G. S. Khush Scholarship for students of rural background.

Scholarships for sports persons

- Sports Scholarships in four major games (viz., Hockey, Football, Athletics and Cricket) and four for the minor games.
- One seat for sports person is reserved in post-graduation.





- College Gold Medal is awarded to a student securing highest OCPA/OGPA (but not less than 8.00 out of 10.00) in the class in B.V.Sc. & A.H programme
- Dr. Balwant Singh Gold Medal is awarded to an all-round best graduate student from all the constituent and affiliated colleges of the university.

Merit Certificates

Merit Certificates are awarded to the students who achieve an OCPA/OGPA of 8.00 or more (out of 10.00) at the end of B.V.Sc. & A.H degree programme.

DISCIPLINE IS VITAL FOR TRIUMPH

"Rules and regulations in any institution are important, as these enable discipline for students, make the institution orderly and maintain the quality of the institute"

- Dean of the college can expel or rusticate a student for indiscipline for 2-4 semesters.
- Dean can revoke decision within 15 days.

- Student will not be on rolls & no fee will be charged during rustication.
- Student can only attend the class after rustication period is over.

• The Vice-Chancellor has the authority to revise the order of rustication passed by Dean of the college.

Student expelled from college shall not be allowed to seek fresh admission into same or another college of the university without sanction of the Academic Council.



• Student shall be allowed to take readmission only after the expiry of two academic years which excludes the year of rustication.

RAGGING SUMMONS PUNISHMENT

What is ragging?

Any vulgar conduct, that is either conducted through spoken words or as an act which is in effect during teasing or mistreating the junior or fresher is known as ragging.

What are various aspects of Ragging?

Ragging has several aspects including psychological, social, political, economic, cultural and academic dimensions. It means that ragging is not always physical but mental too.

If found guilty, it will lead to expulsion from the institute or registration of F.I.R. under provisions of the Indian Penal Code.

SAY NO TO RAGGING

Every student and his/her parents/guardian are supposed to submit an affidavit that their ward will desist from ragging in any form.

Whom should I report if I come across anything mentioned above?

The college anti-ragging committees and squads have been constituted at the college level to keep a check on the incidents of ragging. What penalty will be imposed if I found indulged in ragging any student?

Any student found indulging in the act of ragging will be strictly dealt with according to the directions given by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.








HOSTEL - A HOME AWAY FROM HOME





Map of GADVASU







